Order Giving Immediate Effect to Court of Appeals Decisions in **Bail Appeals**

IT IS ORDERED:

Notwithstanding Appellate Rule 507(b), in an appeal under Appellate Rule 207 relating to release prior to judgment, the judgment of the Court of Appeals takes immediate effect and full jurisdiction over the case returns to the trial court on the day the Court of Appeals issues its opinion or order deciding the appeal. The clerk is directed to return the record in such cases forthwith upon issuance of the opinion or order of the Court of Appeals. This standing order does not affect the time within which a petition for hearing may be filed in the Supreme Court in such a case.
