THE SUPREME COURT OF THE STATE OF ALASKA ORDER NO. 147

Amending Alaska Bar Rule II, Section 1

It Is ORDERED:

Alaska Bar Rule II, Section 1 is amended to read as follows:

Section 1. Application for Admission.

Every person desiring to be admitted to the Alaska Bar shall execute under oath and file with the Secretary of the Association his completed application in duplicate, with two complete sets of fingerprints and two 2" x 3" photographs showing a front view of head and shoulders and in such form as may be required by the Board of Governors. No application shall be granted unless the applicant is at the time of filing thereof a citizen of the United States or a resident alien in the United States who intends to become a citizen of the United States, over twenty-one (21) years of age, a graduate of a law school approved by the American Bar Association, or an attorney in good standing in the Bar of another State or Territory, and has been a resident of the State for at least sixty (60) days before the date of application for admission if the application is for admission by reciprocity or has been a bona fide resident of the State for at least thirty (30) days immediately before the date of the examination if the application is for admission by examination. The date for certification by the Board that the person be admitted by reciprocity shall be at least ninety (90) days after the application is made. The date for the examination shall be at least seventy-five (75) days after the application for admission by examination is filed. Additional proof of any fact stated in the application may be

required by the Board including a showing that an alien applicant intends to become a citizen of the United States. In the event of failure or refusal of an applicant to furnish any information or proof, or to answer any interrogatory of the Board, pertinent to the pending application, the Board may deny the application. The form of application shall be provided by the Board and the contents thereof may be such as the Board may direct from time to time. To be eligible for admission to the Alaska Bar by examination, an applicant's residence must continue from the date of the examination up to and including the date of his admission.
